• To observe the additional weekly period for Character & Citizenship Education (CCE) stipulated by MOE from 2023, all P4 to P6 students will end lessons at 3 pm on Thursdays for scheduled weeks. Thursday lessons will start in **Term 1 Week 2**.

- For the well-being of students, lunch break is mandated for lessons beyond 1.30 pm. Hence, the lunch break for students on long days will be:

 - ✓ P5: 12.30 pm 1 pm
 - ✓ P6: 12 pm 12.30 pm
- P1 remedial lessons will commence only in Sem 2.
 P2 to P6 remedial/supplementary lessons will commence in Term 2.

- 3. All after-school activities/lessons will commence later, and the teachers will furnish the details at appropriate junctures.

5. Unity's 4A

We appreciate your support to ensure that your children observe the following:

Attendance	Appearance
Students must come to school regularly and *punctually. If they are absent from school, they must submit a letter from parents explaining their absence or a medical certificate if they are unwell.	Students must be neatly attired. Hair must be cut short for boys. Girls must tie up their long hair.

Students must always exhibit the school values of responsibility and respect as well as demonstrate the right behaviours both in and out of school.	Students must be resilient and persevere as well as give their personal best in all that they do.

Please refer to the Student Handbook for the details. *Students should only report to school **from 7 am but before 7.25 am** so that they have time to settle down before their lessons start at 7.30 am. Students are expected to be present in school during curriculum time and discouraged from being taken out of school during term time with no valid reasons.

6. School Rules and Discipline Policy

Good discipline is fundamental to ensuring learning and progress. Our school's philosophy on discipline is to transit every student to reach independence and self-discipline, grounded on sound values. What that means is all students must learn and take onus for their behaviours and the consequences of their actions.

We take a whole-school approach to discipline and articulate explicitly to our students the school rules and expectations at the start of every academic year. **Please refer to the Student Handbook on what are expected of our students.**

Our Character and Citizenship Education (CCE) drives the inculcation of appropriate values and behaviours. To build good character so that your child always does the right thing even when no one is watching, the school expects him/her to act in accordance with the school rules. Do go through the Student Handbook with your child and reinforce the significance of sound values and appropriate behaviours.

7. Use of Mobile Phones / Electronic Devices in School

Students are discouraged from bringing mobile phones or any expensive gadgets, e.g., smartwatch, etc. to school. Should your child bring such unauthorised gadgets/devices, it is his/her responsibility to ensure that they are kept away safely/out of sight. The school will not be liable for any loss of items.

Students are not allowed to use their mobile phones including smartwatches to communicate with others or unauthorised devices during school hours in class or within the school compound. School will have the right to confiscate any gadgets/devices if students are found to be flouting the regulation.

8. Homework Policy

Homework refers to any learning assignments that students are required to complete outside of curriculum time. Homework is meant to reinforce understanding of lessons, cultivate independence towards educational attainment and foster healthy learning dispositions. To inculcate a sense of responsibility in our students, they are to take ownership in recording the homework in their handbook, complete it on time and seek clarifications from their teachers if they have any doubts.

We appreciate parents' support in working with the teachers to monitor your child's homework to ensure he/she is accountable for his/her learning.

9. Health & Well-Being of Students

Safeguarding the health and well-being of all our students is our collective responsibility. At the school level, we will continue to ensure a high level of hygiene to prevent the spread of any viruses.

On your part, if your child is unwell, please ensure that he/she stays at home and seeks medical attention. If your child is recovering from respiratory-related illnesses, please encourage him/her to exercise social responsibility, e.g., by wearing a mask, minimising social interactions with big groups, etc. Should your child develop any contagious disease, please keep him/her away from school **until he/she has fully recovered.**

To ensure that the students have valid reasons for absence from school, only supporting documentation from parents (*not acceptable during weighted assessments and only up to a maximum of 5 per semester*) and medical certificate from professional health practitioners (not TCM) can be accepted.

10. Snack Break

A 10-min mid-day snack break will be implemented in class. Teachers will introduce class routines for snack break to ensure students are accustomed to it, thus maximising curriculum time.

- *Respect and Responsibility* Get your child to keep his/her personal trash and then dispose of it to prevent pest infestation in the classroom.
- Caring Individual Use of reusable plastic food containers is strongly encouraged in line with the school's green efforts.

It is not compulsory for students to eat during this break if they do not require food. Only dry snacks such as **biscuits**, **sandwiches or fruits** should be consumed in class during this snack break. Students are not allowed to go to the canteen to buy food. They will have their staggered recesses at the school canteen during the stipulated timings. Kindly refrain from packing wet food items for your child to consume in class as it will be difficult for them to eat or manage and the food may not last long enough or remain fresh for consumption.

More importantly, discourage your child from consuming unhealthy or junk food such as chips, chocolates and sweets. Simple yet easy to eat snacks such as fruits, biscuits and bread with healthier choice symbols will serve the students' needs well. Eating healthily at a young age will go a long way in cultivating healthy lifestyle when they reach adulthood. To teach our students to plan and be independent, they can pack their light snacks from home and purchase healthy meals from the canteen during recess. Parents will not be allowed to bring food for your child during recess/ lunch/ snack break.

11. Parents Gateway (PG) App

Parents Gateway (PG) is a one-stop portal that strengthens school-home partnership to support our children in their education journey. With the PG App, parents can access all school announcements and give consent for your child's activities anytime, anywhere. To download PG or for its FAQ, visit <u>https://pg.moe.edu.sg/</u>.

Kindly turn on the PG Notification in your phone setting so that you can be alerted to updates from the school and MOE in a timely manner.

The school will be conducting emergency relay system test with parents every term using PG. We appreciate your timely co-operation and consideration to read all the notifications sent out and take the necessary actions.

12. Communications

Regular and open communication between the school and parents will help us achieve our common aim in providing an enriching educational experience for our children. The school will keep you informed of important matters regularly through letters sent **via PG to the stated guardian** (as indicated in the Student Details Report). You can also access these letters from the school website at <u>http://www.unitypri.moe.edu.sg</u>.

- a. Student Handbook
 - The Student Handbook is another means of communication between the parents and teachers.
 - You may write short notes in the handbook addressed to the teacher concerned. Please remind your child to show the teacher the note you have written.
 - Please read through the important information spelt out on Pg 2 to 29 of the Student Handbook and initial on Pg 1.
- b. Contacting or Meeting Teachers
 - You may email the teachers on any matter concerning your child. For school-based concerns, please send to this email address: *unity_ps@moe.edu.sg*.
 - For parents who need to see the teachers, please make appointment with them to ensure their availability and alleviate inconvenience caused before coming to school. You may write a short note in the Student Handbook requesting for an appointment with the teacher/s concerned. Visitors with no prior appointment will be turned away.
 - Kindly do not venture beyond the General Office when you are in the school. Your cooperation will help us maintain a safe and secure environment for your children.
 - To ensure well-being and work-life harmony of our teachers, **please contact them only during school days between 7.30 am and 6 pm**. We appreciate your consideration not to expect the teachers to respond to you during the weekends and school holidays or if your queries or requests are made beyond the school hours. They will do their best to respond to your queries as soon as possible.
 - During curriculum hours, the teachers will not be contactable or have access to their email when they are in class. If the queries or requests made during work hours are urgent, parents should contact the General Office for assistance.
- c. <u>School Calendar of Events</u>

- d. Information Booklet for Parents
 - The Information Booklet for Parents detailing the various subject syllabuses and assessment information will be uploaded onto the school website by the end of T1 W1 2024. A copy will also be sent to you via PG.

13. Safety and Security

Safety and security in our school is of paramount concern. We urge all parents to observe the following to keep the school safe for your child:

- a. Vehicular/ Pedestrian Access and Road Safety
 - The entire Choa Chu Kang Crescent along which the school is located has been redesignated a Silver Zone and there will be enforcement (refer to attached advisory from LTA) against vehicles that are parked outside School Main Gate. All parents and visitors will have to drive into the school to drop off/ pick up students/passengers.
 - Heed traffic rules, drive slowly in the school compound and queue patiently for dropoff and moving off.
 - Make sure that your children are ready with their bags to disembark briskly and safely from the vehicle and not hold up other vehicles waiting in line.
 - To reduce traffic congestion within the school compound, you may use the nearby HDB driveways as quick drop-off & pick-up points for your child. In consideration of the residents, please do not park and wait there.
 - As with all good habits, foster road safety practices from an early age for your child.
 - Children are the most vulnerable road users, and they need to be taught how to be road smart. Remind them to comply with the guidelines to be safe and considerate pedestrians.
 - Extend graciousness and respect to the security guards who have the duty to keep the school secure.
 - An important part of teaching your child road safety is to model safe behaviours yourself.
- b. No Right Turn for Vehicles Exiting School
 - A reminder that there is **no right turn** for vehicles exiting the school from **6.45 am to 7.45 am & 1.45 pm to 2.00 pm** to facilitate smoother and safer traffic flow.
 - All vehicles exiting during that timing will need to turn left. We seek the cooperation of all drivers to comply with the regulation to mitigate the traffic congestion in the school carpark and the road outside.
- c. All Visitors to School
 - Make an appointment before turning up at the school. Visitors with no appointment will be turned away.
 - Register at the Security Post before proceeding to the General Office for assistance.
 - Wear the issued Visitor Pass while in the school premises and ensure that it is visible.
 - Visitors will have to comply with the safety measures and be disallowed to go beyond any unauthorised areas unaccompanied by our staff.
 - There is strictly no parking for all visitors.

Parents/Caregivers

- Wait at the appropriate dismissal venue regardless of weather conditions.
- Wait at the appropriate dismissal venue of the younger/youngest sibling. Arrange with and inform your children where they should be picked up.
- Pick up P1 & P2 children at the designated waiting area within the school.
- Do not crowd outside Side Gate 3 but keep the pavement clear for the students. Wait at the sheltered HDB void deck.

Students

- Bring an umbrella to school every day.
- Can be dismissed via Side Gate 1 & 2 if they have a P1 or P2 sibling or be dismissed collectively via a gate that is convenient for the family. Dismissal points **should not vary** on a day-to-day basis so as not to confuse the students and teachers.
- Wait at the canteen for siblings before proceeding to the appropriate dismissal gate if they are going home together without any adults.
- Walk along the pavement instead of on the road and not cross the road recklessly.
- Comply with road safety regulations. Exercise the kerb drills and safe pedestrian practices. Be considerate road users.

16. Visual Screening and Temperature-Taking

In line with the guidelines from MOE, temperature-taking will be conducted at the start of each semester. The temperature-taking exercise for Term 1, 2024 will take place on Wed, 10 Jan 24. We seek your assistance in ensuring that your child brings a working Oral Digital Thermometer to school every day. For P1, the school will be issuing your child with a one-time free ODT by Fri, 5 Jan 24.
